- How expensive is it to go out in the evening where you live?
- Do you like going to the cinema?

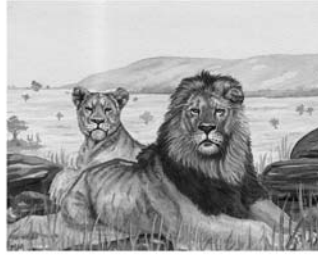
